SYNOPSIS

What's Bluebird about? The story centres around a university lecturer and his PhD student on a research trip to a remote village in England to write about its dark history.

They think they know some of the stories. A burglar shot dead; a tragedy on the train tracks; and remnants of psychological experiments from the Cold War. But as they meet the inhabitants of Renslow, and try to make sense of their sometimes-odd behaviour, they wonder how much of this is connected, and how much is just them seeing patterns.

One of the read-through script-testers pronounced it 'a fantastic mix of *Twin Peaks*, British rural hauntology, *The X-Files*, contemporary true crime drama and the psychogeographic world of Minimum Labyrinth'.
